




- **“Pot 1” Equal Share State Allocation**
 - 35% RESTORE (7% each state)
 - FL - 75% 8 disproportionately affected counties, 25% remaining 15 Gulf coast counties
 - Locally-controlled
- **“Pot 2” Gulf Coast Ecosystem Restoration Council**
 - 30% (+50% interest) RESTORE
 - 5 governors, 6 federal agencies
 - Comprehensive Recovery Plan
 - Emphasis on environmental recovery
- **“Pot 3” Impact-based State Allocation**
 - 30% RESTORE
 - FL - Gulf Consortium
 - Multi-Year State Expenditure Plan
 - Environmental AND Economic recovery


- **January 13, 2014**

- TBRPC staff met with Grover Robinson, Gulf Consortium Chair
- Brainstorm process to equitably distribute “Pot 3” funds
 - Need for regional approach/leadership
 - Vision of Florida post-Deepwater Horizon recovery

- **February 18, 2014**

- TBRPC staff met with representatives from four counties
 - Ad hoc efforts throughout the state
 - Southwest Florida Regional Ecosystem Restoration Plan as a model
 - Uneven presence of NEPs throughout the Gulf coast
 - Expertise on economic recovery
