2. **Coastal High Hazard Area** - (Continued Discussion) The Regional Planning Advisory Committee (RPAC), with recommendations provided by the Coastal High Hazard Area (CHHA) Subcommittee and the TBRPC staff, has been discussing the issues related to the 2006 legislative changes related to the CHHA and Hazard Mitigation. In the counties, planners are working to seek concurrence among the local governments on identifying the most hazardous coastal areas and in responding to the requirements of Section 163.3178(9) of the Florida Statutes. A brief overview will be provided by staff with an update on the work that has progressed so far from Committee members.

4. **Education Initiative on Development's Impact on Water Quality**- Dr. Amy Shoher, University of Florida/IFAS specialist in Landscape Nutrient and Runoff Management, will describe the Nonpoint Source Education for Municipal Officials Program and its benefits to local governments. This national program is made up of local chapters geared to each region's particular water quality issues. The network of chapters (30 nationwide) share curricula and materials to conduct ongoing education for local decision makers on the links between land use and water resource protection. Implications are significant regarding TMDL implementation and tackling other stormwater requirements. There is some interest in creating a chapter in the Tampa Bay area.
