RECAP/OVERVIEW OF JULY 11-12

SERC MEETINGS

E-Plan status update:

- **78% electronic submittal rate with expectation to exceed 90% in future years;**
- **The transmittal of the University of Texas at Dallas correspondence may have created unintended consequences; and**
- **Florida will continue to use and promote E-Plan. If user fees are assessed to facilities, it is anticipated that they will be paid by the State of Florida since Florida already implements registration fees annually.**

Supplemental Environmental Projects Update

- The SERC/FDEM staff is nearing completion of the Supplemental Environmental Projects website, linkable from the SERC homepage.
- The website will be patterned after the State of Illinois' SEP website based on its ease of use, intuitiveness and its interactivity. The website is: www.epa.state.il.us/enforcement/sep/
- Initially, relatively generic projects of varying costs will be listed on Florida's that could be applied Statewide.
- FDEM is continually looking to supplement the listing with local proposals which could include needs or resources identified by Hazmat Teams.

RECAP/OVERVIEW OF JULY 11-12 SERC MEETINGS

DSOC – Hazmat Team recommendation: *“Reduce the Statewide number of Hazmat Teams to 18 with a maximum of 3 per Region”*

- Requested reduction in # of teams appears to be arbitrary and without consideration of Threats & Vulnerabilities in terms of target areas, including: locations of Radiological facilities, Population concentrations, Bulk Chemical Storage, Military Bases, Pipelines and/or other significant factors.
- While most of the operational costs associated with the Hazmat Teams are borne by local governments, federal funding is used to supplement equipment/resources purchases as well as provide advanced training.

RECAP/OVERVIEW OF JULY 11-12 SERC MEETINGS

DSOC – Hazmat Team recommendation

- Currently there are six State-recognized Hazmat teams serving the Tampa Bay Region (Hillsborough, Tampa, Pinellas, Pasco, Citrus and Polk).
- SERC unanimously approved transmittal of a correspondence requesting postponement of Hazmat Team reduction until, at least, the following measures have been implemented: conduct of a Statewide Threats and Vulnerabilities assessment; consider allowing the “locals” to disperse the funding within each Region; and determine fate of existing hazmat resources and personnel if action results in the deactivation of a Hazmat Team(s).







