2020-2021 THOMAS YATABE AWARDS RECOGNITION

Signifying outstanding contribution(s) made in implementing and supporting the Emergency Planning and Community Right-To-Know Act, the Tampa Bay LEPC Thomas Yatabe Award for 2020 is with this being awarded to James "JJ" Johnston. His Nomination Form read as follows:

James "JJ" Johnston played invaluable roles with the Tampa Bay LEPC while representing Pasco County Emergency Management over the past 14 years. During his tenure with the Tampa Bay LEPC, Mr. Johnston graciously served as LEPC Vice-Chair (from August 2014 - October 2019) and Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness Training Subcommittee Chair (from February 2011 to October 2019). As the HMEP Training Chair, Mr. Johnson oversaw, coordinated, facilitated, and directed more than \$500,000 in hazardous materials training opportunities for public-sector first responders across all six Counties which constitute the Tampa Bay LEPC District.

His dedication to serving in both capacities for lengthy terms certainly exemplifies "Outstanding contributions made in the implementation and support of the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act through achievement(s), accomplishment(s) or superior participation in hazardous material planning or response."

It is understood that Mr. Johnston has been "lured" out of retirement and is currently assisting the State of Florida with warehouse storage management and logistics.

Signifying outstanding contribution(s) made in implementing and supporting the Emergency Planning and Community Right-To-Know Act, the Tampa Bay LEPC Thomas Yatabe Award for 2021 is hereby being awarded to John Meyer. His Nomination Form read as follows:

Mr. Meyer has filled many roles within the Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council (TBRPC) since his initial hire in 1985. His professional endeavors with TBRPC included management and administration of the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) and Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness (HMEP) Grant Programs. As part of his prior familiarity with these Programs, Mr. Meyer was initially appointed to serve on the LEPC as a “Non-Elected Local Official” representing the TBRPC from 1998 until his promotion to the LEPC Coordinator position in 2008.

Mr. Meyer has furthered the LEPC & HMEP Programs through the following accomplishments, to name a few:

- established and maintained multiple online LEPC program resources;*
- spearheaded the conduct of numerous regional hazardous materials exercises and EPCRA How-to- Comply/E-Plan Workshops;*
- coordinated conduct of a Commodity Flow Study to quantify and record directional travel of hazardous materials commodities being transported by truck on select regional roadways on predetermined dates;*
- oversaw the development of the All Hazards Guide for Businesses: Planning for Risks resource document and preparation of a one-page Tampa Bay LEPC Information Sheet for dissemination at many LEPC functions;*
- took meticulous meeting notes at the SERC quarterly meetings, which were always provided to Tampa Bay LEPC members as part of the respective Agenda materials and were often shared with FDEM staff and LEPC colleagues;*
- provided guidance to numerous LEPC Coordinators that are/were new to the Program;*
- acquired a trailer and various hazardous materials training props/equipment under the HMEP Program. While housed at Hillsborough County Fire Rescue, such resources are considered shareable amongst interested agencies in the Tampa Bay LEPC District to aid in their training; and*
- coordinated the conduct of 222 hazardous materials training courses that attracted nearly 5,000 public-sector first responders at a cumulative expense of more than \$850,000 over his 13-year affiliation with the HMEP Program.*

Mr. Meyer is set to retire at the end of 2021. His cherished memories include all of the wonderful relationships he has formulated in his career. He graciously thanks all involved in fulfilling the numerous objectives of the LEPC and HMEP Grant Programs and other Council Programs. Mr. Meyer remains confident that his successor will continue to operate and manage the LEPC to stay one of the more renowned in the State.

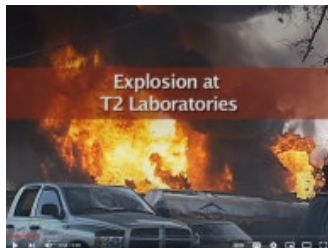

RECAP OF QUARTERLY SERC MEETINGS

The State Emergency Response Commission and associated Subcommittee meetings were held at the Plaza Resort & Spa on January 18-19, 2022. LEPC Chair Robert Bassett, HMEP Chair Captain Bloski, and LEPC Coordinator Brian Ellis attended the meetings. The SERC's Training Task Force (TTF) and the LEPC Staff & Chairs meetings were conducted the day prior.



RECAP OF SERC MEETINGS Jan 18-19, 2022 Daytona, FL

TRAINING TASK FORCE (TTF) (Jan 18, 2022, 8:30am)

INTRODUCTIONS - Roll call was conducted, and self-identification of others in attendance. COVID Testing kits were made available for those who might need them.

MINUTES October 21, 2021, Minutes approved.

RECAP OF TTF CONF CALL: They discussed the HAZMAT Symposium, Offshore HAZMAT, and BUXIS.

PROJECT BOXES: SharePoint has been used to track the status of TTF projects. Members were asked to report back on any projects showing to be updated or removed.

OFFSHORE HAZMAT PROJECT- The initial 2–3-day training pilot will be held in April in Ft. Lauderdale. It will be basic training for saving lives and rescuing victims in the waterborne environment. Three different sets of PPE have been identified and can be mixed and matched. Teams must be familiar with their waterborne PPE before arriving. LEPCs HMEP funds can fund PPE for those who don't already have it. A USCG and Civil Support Team member will be there to give input. The class will come to other areas later.

2022 HAZMAT SYMPOSIUM- The TTF meeting was held in conjunction with the HAZMAT Symposium. Seven teams competed in the HAZMAT Competition.

NEW BUSINESS

- TTF members asked that a letter be sent from the TTF, each LEPC, or the LEPC Chair of Chairs to ask State Fire Marshal's office to open the rule that requires training on fire gear as part of the requirement to be a Florida Certified HAZMAT Technician. It causes problems for those that aren't firefighters seeking certification since the HAZMAT 160 hr class does not cover primary use of fire gear. Those seeking task book completion and state certification do not have a way to get this unless they take FF1 training. Another member said SFM does not have a process to recognize nonfirefighter HAZMAT certifications because SFM's endorsement is not required for anyone other than firefighters. They can meet OSHA 1910.120 and be recognized by the Authority Having Jurisdiction.
- TTF should look at the HAMAT Technician Task Book before the NFPA Update/rule change
- HAZMAT Alert is an alert for hospitals that a patient en route to the hospital has been contaminated.

AGENCY UPDATES- Rep and personnel changes.

LEPC CHAIRPERSONS AND COORDINATORS (Jan 18, 2021, 12:30 PM)

INTRODUCTIONS – Mr. Rick Delp chaired the meeting. It was held in person in conjunction with the 2022 HAZMAT Symposium, with a virtual option. The meeting was called to order at 12:30 pm. Roll call was conducted, as well as self-identification of others in attendance.

MEETING MINUTES- The minutes from October 21, 2021, meeting were approved.

TRAINING TASK FORCE UPDATE -see TTF recap

DISTRICT REPORTS - The Coordinators for the ten statewide LEPCs self-identified their recent initiatives. Issues brought out in discussion included:

- Drones for HAZMAT- have to have a pilot's license.
- HAZMAT alert- like a stroke alert saying someone has had an exposure.

2022 HAZMAT SYMPOSIUM- There were 540 registrants.

NEW SERC COORDINATOR: Ms. Pebbles was introduced as the new SERC Coordinator.

NEW BUSINESS:

2020/2021 THOMAS YATABE AWARD WINNER- The award will be presented tomorrow, and names read out during the Symposium ceremonies.

OTHER AWARDS-; Chairmen Delp will develop initial guidance for recognizing long-time or highly contributing staff, Chairmen, or SERC/TTF participants. The awards committee consists of Ric Delp, Tyler Nolan, and Butch.

OTHER BUSINESS:

HA WORKING GROUP DISCUSSION – The group met last week. If anything needs to be changed or added to the HA Manual, please notify Tyler Nolan.

HOW TO COMPLY MANUAL- The manual is being updated.

JOINT LETTER TO SFM TO OPEN RULE –State Fire Marshal's office has a rule that to be a state-certified HAZMAT Technician, you must have basic training on firefighting gear. This is taught in FF1 training, not the HAZMAT 160 hr class. This is problematic for those seeking state HAZMAT Tech certification from non-fire disciplines. The HAZMAT Tech task books already need to be tweaked to align with the new NFPA standard, so it is an excellent time to reconsider the rule. A motion was made and approved to have the LEPC Chair of Chairs send a letter on behalf of all LEPCs to the Florida State Fire Marshal's Office, requesting clarification on HAZMAT Tech Certification and requesting they open the rule.

STATE EMERGENCY RESPONSE COMMISSION (January 19, 2022, 9:00 am)

INTRODUCTIONS AND VERIFICATION OF QUORUM- There was not a quorum, so no votes were taken.

MEETING MINUTES- Skipped due to lack of quorum.

LEPC APPOINTMENTS- New members were not approved because of a lack of quorum.

THOMAS YATABE-SERC AWARD NOMINATIONS- SERC presented the Thomas Yatabe Awards to the 2020 and 2021 nominees from each LEPCs. Emerald Coast LEPC members: Capt Tim Howard, Bay Co Fire Rescue (2020), and Mr. Shayne Stewart, FDOH (2021) received the award.

SPECIAL AWARDS FOR EXTREME SERVICE: Awards were given to two individuals for over 30 years of service to the LEPCs, SERC, and State of Florida: Manny Cela (42 yrs of service) and John Meyer (36 years).

REPORTS

TRAINING TASK FORCE UPDATE -see TTF recap: to ask for endorsement for TTF and LEPC Chairs to send a letter. Chair of Chairs to also submit a similar letter to SFM to open the rule for HAZMAT Tech certification.

UPDATE FROM HA WORKING GROUP- HA Workgroup recently met and discussed Tier II and E-Plan issues to make it easier for the facilities and how to get the HAs into the hands of the responders.

LEPC CHAIR/COORDINATORS UPDATE- see LEPC Chairs/Staff recap and HAZMATTERS.

FINANCIAL STATUS REPORT- The operating trust fund is slowly being drawn down. The fees have remained the same since 1999, but costs and inflation have outpaced the fund. This fund also pays for all State HAZMAT Activities, contracts, committees, and FDEM's technological hazards personnel salary. However, the trust fund is anticipated to fall below required levels in two years, A Legislative Budget Request has been submitted to move FDEM Tech hazards staff salary's to General Revenue instead of the Trust Fund, however if it is not accepted, changes will have to occur. HAZMAT INCIDENTS- See attachment—no major releases requiring a federal response.

UPDATE ON STAFF ACTIVITIES- FDEM has recently hired new personnel to replace outgoing staff. Sam Brackett (34 yrs of service), Trish Tidwell, Marie Green (30 yrs), and Anhar AlSadi have either retired or have moved onto new positions.

2022 HAZMAT SYMPOSIUM- It was a phenomenal year, with more than 500 registrants. They have put a lot of COVID processes in place, including hand sanitizers, masks, free covid tests, increased hotel cleanings.

PRESENTATION ON BUXUS – Lindsay Sanders gave an update on BUXUS. The app is meant to connect responders with information in an emergency to speed response and minimize consequences. They now have Florida Gas, Florida Southeast Pipe and Kinder Morgan in the system, and more are considering participating. The system is now cable of including electrical facilities, though none are currently in the system.

DISASTER PLANNING SUBCOMMITTEE (FDPS)

The HMEP Planning Team remains ready to conduct Siren Workshops and companion Shelter-in-Place presentations at the request of various schools, community groups, and civic associations near the Port of Tampa and to facilitate objectives raised by members of the Tampa Bay LEPC.

Future meetings of the Facility Disaster Planning Subcommittee (FDPS) will be scheduled as needed. All LEPC members and the public are welcome to attend and participate in these meetings as may be scheduled.

Each year, the Tampa Bay LEPC receives HMEP funding to assist in meeting some of the hazardous materials training objectives/needs of public-sector first responders within the Tampa Bay LEPC's six County District, including their associated municipalities. Noting that the program is/was established with U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) funding, each course must be pre-approved by FDEM/USDOT, meet FDEM's cost-effectiveness criteria, and be transportation-related or at least include a transportation component or nexus. Each course conducted typically consists of a nominal fee to be retained by the LEPC/TBRPC to cover administrative expenses.

The FY 2021-22 HMEP Contract spans the period of October 1, 2021 - September 30, 2022. A breakdown of tentative expenses associated with this Contract can be provided.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN - 2022 Update

The annual update of the Tampa Bay LEPC Hazardous Materials Emergency Response Plan is required to be submitted on (or before) June 30, 2021. To facilitate this timeline, LEPC staff is about to initiate coordination efforts with the County Emergency Management agencies, fire departments, and others, offering to assist with the update and verify various sections of the Plan. For the convenience of those willing to participate in this endeavor, LEPC staff can/would provide electronic copies of the current. A motion will be solicited at the May 25, 2022 LEPC meeting to authorize the LEPC Chair to transmit the

revised Plan to the Florida Division of Emergency Management upon completion, in accordance with the Contract requirement. All revisions will ultimately be incorporated into one unified/revised document.

The updates will be reviewed by FDEM staff, edited if/where applicable by LEPC staff, and forwarded to the State Emergency Response Commission for their approval, typically in association with their annual October meeting.

Upon approval by the SERC, Mr. Ellis will promptly provide electronic copies of the updated Plan to all required entities and post the updated Plan to the Tampa Bay LEPC website.
