# TAMPA BAY REGIONAL PLANNING COUNCIL

#### 2023 Session

• 717 Bills filed so far

#### **Important Dates**

- March 7: First Day of Session; Final Member Bill Filing Deadline
- **April 16:** End of Reconsideration of Bills in Committees
- **April 22:** Unless otherwise directed, House Bills are transmitted to the Senate; Senate bills are certified.
- **May 5:** Last day of Regular Session

### Governor's Budget Conservation Proposals | Fiscal Year 2023-2024



- \$50 million Total Maximum Daily Loads; nutrient pollution reduction projects in Basin Management Action Plan and other restoration plans. In line with the Blue-Green Algae Task Force consensus findings.
- \$65 million Improve water quality and combat the impacts of Harmful Algal Blooms, including blue-green algae and red tide
- \$50 million Land Acquisition Trust Fund for springs restoration and land acquisitions
- \$50 million Alternative Water Supply Grant Program
- \$85 million DEP to continue the stabilization, water treatment, and closure of Piney Point facility

### Governor's Budget Resilience Proposals | Fiscal Year 2023-2024



- \$406 million Resilient Florida Program
  - \$350 million Statewide Flooding and Sea Level Rise Resilience Plan
  - \$56 million Resiliency planning and coral reef protection

• First Reading: Publication in Journal




Bill Passes

Bill Fails




Senate / House
If the Bill passed in one house,
it is sent to the other for review
until consensus is reached.



**April 22:** House Bills transmitted to Senate; Senate bills are certified.

**May 5:** Last Day of Regular Session.

Sign Bill into law or Bill becomes law without signature



2/3 Legislature (Senate and House) votes to Override Veto

### HB 371 Management and Storage of Surface Waters



Representative Killebrew District 48

- Amends Florida Water Resources Act
- Exempts from regulation,
  - Environmental habitat creation
  - Restoration
  - Enhancement activities, or
  - Water quality improvements on agricultural or government lands
- Removes case-by-case analysis and written notice requirements
- Net increase in wetland habitat



### HB 111 Public Financing of Potentially At-Risk Structure and Infrastructure



Representative Hunchofsky District 95



- Prepare coastal regions for future sea level rise
- Adds erosion as an addressable issue
- Discrete or compound natural hazard events

# Flood Disclosure for Residential and Commercial Property Sales

• Requires disclosure of certain flood information to prospective purchasers

- Requires notice via text message of
  - Date of the findings of contamination
  - Levels of contamination
  - Date of restoration of potable water



### SB 172 / HB 177 Safe Waterways Act

Representative Gossett-Seidman District 91



- Applies to contaminated water bodies
- Close public waters under conditions hazardous to health
- Requires health advisory signs

# HB 423 Implementation of the Recommendations of the Blue-Green Algae Task Force



Representative Cross
District 60

- Requires inspection of sewage treatment and disposal systems
- Pollutant load reductions must meet requirements in Basin Management Action Plans (BMAPs)
- Considers increasingly higher pollutant loads
- Requires reevaluation of mitigation and elimination strategies

### HB 527 Office of the Blue Economy



Representative Skidmore District 92

- Added to the Department of Economic Opportunity
- Promotes sectors of ocean and coastal resources
  - Economic Development
  - Sustainability
  - Academic Research
  - Environmental Issues

### Regulation of Single-Use Plastic Products

- Allows Coastal Communities to implement single-use plastic product regulation pilot programs
- Requires report on regulation of a range of disposable plastic bags

## SB 498 Preemption of Recyclable and Polystyrene Materials





Senator Stewart District 17

 Removes the preemption of local laws regulating auxiliary containers, wrappings, disposable plastic bags, and the use or sale of polystyrene products to FDACS.

### SB 506

## Comprehensive Waste Reduction and Recycling Plan





Senator Stewart District 17

- Requiring FL DEP to develop a 3 year
   Comprehensive Waste Reduction and Recycling Plan
- Statewide education and outreach.
   Provide recommendations to reinstate the Recycling and Education Grant Program, and other means of providing local government assistance.

### HB 557 / SB 602 Land Acquisition Trust Fund





Representative Bell District 49



Senator Burton
District 12

 Provides \$20 million annually to DEP to protect headwaters, including that of Alafia and Hillsborough, under the Heartland Headwaters Protection and Sustainability Act

### HB 439 Land Use and Development Regulations Land





Representative McClain District 27

- Removes or amends statutory barriers to urban sprawl
- Local governments must accept Special Magistrate recommendations under FLUEDRA

### HB 41

### Land Development Initiative and Referendum Processes





Representative Garcia
District 115

- Prohibits initiatives and referendum processes for
  - Development orders
  - Amendments to land development regulations

#### CS / SB 170 Local Ordinances



Senator Trumbull
District 2

- Requires "Business Impact Estimates" before passing an ordinance
  - Estimate direct economic impact
  - Identify new fees
  - Estimate regulatory costs
  - Estimate number of impacted businesses
- Requires suspension of ordinances challenged in court if
  - Preempted
  - Arbitrary
  - Unreasonable
- General exceptions apply
